Ilú is also called adaró, or daró. Oyá's movements symbolize winds and storms—and at a fast tempo this rhythm can really sound like that! As mentioned previously with reference to Oxóssi and Omolu, an optional way of playing the lê and hunpi parts is to phrase the 32nd notes as grace notes—but the sticking remains the same.
